Dear Tony: On behalf of the Tarrywile Park Authority and staff, I would like to take this opportunity to thank you and the members of the CT Valley Baseball Club for volunteering your time and talent to help us at Tarrywile Park. On April 19<sup>th</sup> the team volunteered to help clear a parcel of land of small trees and brush helping us to minimize the threat of fire while helping to cleanup the road edge so that it fits better into the neighboring residential parcels that border it. You went on to continue with this same type of project on the area just above our Children's Garden, an area that we had been working on for several weeks to clear of unwanted brush. In driving down Brushy Hill Rd. you can now see all the way into the garden – which was one of our major objectives on this project. The area still needs a little work but is now much more manageable for our staff to complete.

On May 3<sup>rd</sup> your team volunteered their time to participate in Clean City Danbury by helping the Tarrywile Park team clean Brushy Hill Rd. Twenty-four (24) tires (most with rims) were cleared from an embankment as well as two (2) TV sets, a wire mattress frame and several bags of garbage and debris. This was back breaking work but the boys were up for the challenge and did an excellent job in record time.

Our thanks go to Bryson Herr, Steven Kuss, Jimmy Medrano, Kevin Butler, Dean Tresca, Nick Tresca, John Perrino, Chris Haylon, Jack Sexton, Mark Sottile, David Long and A. J. Morrissey as well as several dads who came along to help. And a special thanks to you for your help in organizing this effort.

Without help from groups like yours, our job at Tarrywile Park would never get done. We rely heavily on volunteers to help us maintain this 722 acre passive recreation Park. With its 21 miles of hiking trails and 17 buildings, volunteers are our only answer to keeping it clean and viable for all residents of the Danbury area to come and enjoy.

We thank you again and hope to work with you in the future. Our National Trails Day event which is a day of trail maintenance takes place on Saturday June 7<sup>th</sup> from 9:00am to 3:00pm.
